Indian Society of Tobacco Science (Regd), (Tobacco Res. Workers' Association of India) came into existence in 1974 and was registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860.

The main objective of the Society is to encourage and promote dissemination of scientific knowledge by arranging National Symposia, Exhibitions and collaboration of the research work being carried out by the National Institutions, Tobacco Trade and Agriculture.

The Society also undertakes the publication of a halfyearly research journal 'Tobacco Research' to bring into wide circulation the latest experimental findings on all aspects of tobacco. The membership of the Society is open aspects of tobacco. to all individuals/organisations in any field of research related to tobacco crop and tobacco products.

The headquarters of the Society is located at Central Tobacco Research Institute, Rajahmundry-533 105, Andhra Pradesh, India.

- The name of the Society shall be 'INDIAN SOCIETY OF 1. Name: TOBACCO SCIENCE'
- 2. Present Address: Indian Society of Tobacco Science, C/o Central Tobacco Research Institute, Rajahmundry-533 105, AP
- 3. Area of Operation: All over India
- 4. Aims and Objects: The purpose of the Society shall be to promote the cause of the Tobacco Research Workers in all aspects by
- (a) holding national and international meetings and symposia once in four years with a view to diffuse scientific knowledge among them and the public,
- (b) publishing a half-yearly journal for the present which shall be called 'TOBACCO RESEARCH' to enable the tobacco research workers, specially in India, to disseminate the research findings quickly for the benefit of the tobacco growers, as well as the manufacturers of tobacco products,
- (c) encouraging original investigations in the research institutes and manufacturing establishments,
- (d) providing a library for the benefit of the members and

(e) other activities approved by the Society or Executive

- 5. Membership and Subscriptions:
- (a) Membership of the Society shall be open to all individuals interested in any field of research related to tobacco crop and tobacco products.
- (b) There shall be four classes of members, viz. Life, Ordinary, Student and Honarary. Life Members are those who pay a sum of Rs.300/- in India or \$ 100.00 or £ 65.00 abroad in lumpsum or in 10 instalments within a span of one year. Ordinary members are those who pay in Annual Subscription of Rs.40/- or \$ 18.00 or 9.00 abroad. For the student members, the s bscription will be 50% of the subscription for ordinary members. The Honorary Membership shall be restricted to persons eminent for their contribution to Tobacco Research. The total number of Honorary Members shall not at the time of selection exceed five percent of the total number of Life and Ordinary Members. Honorary Members shall be selected at the Annual General Body Meeting of the Society.
- (c) There shall be an admission fee of Rs.5/- in India or \$ 1.00 or € 0.50 abroad for Membership.
- (d) The Annual Subscription to the Solicty's half-yearly journal by non-members shall be Rs.150/- in India or \$25.00 abroad inclusive of postage (Surface Mail). \$ 6.00 or 3.00 will be extra if the journal is to be sent by Air Mail.
- (e) The General Body can revise the membership and subscription rates from time to time.
- (f) Any member who defaults payment of Subscription to the Society for a periof of more than one year ceases to be a member. The membership fee is always payable in advance.
- 6. (a) Ordinary and Life Members have the right to vote and hold office, and fare further entitled to the issues of the journal of the society and any other publications, the society may publish. Voting by Proxy shall not be permissible except in the case of Patrons. No member present shall have two votes. Student members shall have no right of voting but will be entitled to have the issues of publications of the Society.
 - (b) Honorary Members shall enjoy all the privileges of Life Members, except that they shall not be cligible for any office or to vote at the meetings of the Society.
- 7. Financial Year: The financial year of the Society will be from 1st January to 31st December.
- 8. Patrons: Any person, Institution/Company denating a sum not less than Rs.2500/- (\$ 500.00) to help the cause of the Society shall be a Patron of the Society. The Patron or his representative shall enjoy all the privileges of a Life Member.
- 9. Executive Committee:
- (a) There shall be an Executive Committee, which shall carry on all the affairs of the Society. It shall implement the policies of the Society, as decided at the General Body Meetings.
- (b) The Executive Committee shall sonsist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer an Editor and six members.

(c) Among the office bearers, the Secretary and the Treasurer shall be members residing at the Headquarters of the Society

- (c) There shall be atleast wo meetings of the Committee to transact the business of the Society.
- (d) Extraordinary meetings of the committee shall be called by the President on a requisition signed by seven members of the Committee or at his own discretion when be shall direct the Secretary to issue notice for the purpose. For attending such a meeting the member shall be paid actual concessional First Class Train Fare by the Society. If found absolutely necessary the President may carry on the business of the Committee and the Editorial Board through correspondence.
- 12. General Body and its functions:
- (a) All members who are not in arrears are eligible for participation in the General Body Meetings. (See Rule 14 (1).
- (b) The General Body
 - (i) Elects the Executive Committee Members.
 - (ii) Passes the Budget of the Society for the ensuing year and approve the expenditure statement of the previous year.
 - (iii) Approves the report of the Secretary on the activities of the Society.
 - (iv) Appoints auditor(s) for scrubinising the accounts
 of the Society.
- (c) The time, date and venue of the Annual General Body Meeting shall be arranged by the Executive Committee in co-operation with other organisations having similar purpose, if possible. The venue will be fixed by the Executive Committee according to facilities and convenience of the members.
- (d) The Agenda for the Annual General Body Meeting will be circulated atleast one month in advance.
- (e) An extraordinary meeting of the Society will be convened if one third of the members of the Society send a signed requisition to the Secretary for such a meeting. An emergent or extraordinary meeting of the General Body may be called by the Committee by giving the members 21 days notice.
 - (f) Meetings of the Society shall be presided over by the President or in his absence, by the Vice-President or by a member of the society elected at the meeting. One fifth of the ordinary and life members shall form the Quorm.
 - 13. Meetings of the Editorial Board:
 - (a) An Annual Meeting of the Editorial Board shall be held at the time of the Annual General Body Meeting of the Society if desired by the President.
 - (b) Ordinary meeting of the Editorial Board may be called by the Editor.
 - 14. Election of Office Bearers:
 - (a) The Election of Office Bearers shall take place at the Annual General Body Meeting of the Society. The Executive Committee will co-opt members to fill up interim vacancies
 - (b) The following procedure shall be adopted for all elections to office. The Secretary shall circulate a list of members two months before the Annual General Body Meeting. He shall invite nominations by any member duly seconded by another member and shall also ascertain the willingness of the nominee for the office before 30 days of election.

The list of valid nomination shall be circulated among members before 15 days of the Annual General Body Meeting.

- (c) All voting shall be by secret ballot on forms supplied by the Secretary and returned as advised by the Secretary.
- (d) Votes shall be scrutinised at the Annual General Body Meeting by persons nominated for the purpose.
- (e) Candidate securing highest number of votes shall be declared elected. Tie shall be decided by drawing lots.
- (f) All retiring office bearers shall be eligible for re-election.
- (g) Once in every year after one month from the date of the General Body Meeting of the Society a list of members with their occupation and address shall be filed with the Registrar of Societies.
- (h) A member may withdraw from the Society by signifying his desire to do so in a letter addressed to the Secretary. The Secretary however shall not be liable to return any fee that may have been paid by the member in advance.

15. Funds:

17. Amendments:

- (a) The above rules may be amended at any General Body Meeting of the Society by 2/3 majority of the members present, and voting for the amendment, provided that no amendments to add, alter or delete any rules and or clauses of memorandum of the rules and regulations of the Society shall be made without the previous approval of the Commissioner of Income Tax.
- (b) Any amendment proposed by a member should be forwarded to the Secretary one menth in advance of the General Body Meeting for circulation among the member, except in urgent matters.

18. Winding up:

- (a) In the event of dissolution of the Society all the remaining funds and assets will transferred to any other instituion having similar objects and aims and which has been recognised by the Income Taxt Act, 1961 and to which the provision of Sec.80(G) shall apply.
- (b) This x is to be determined by the votes of not less than three fifth of the memberspresent personally at the time of the dissolution.
